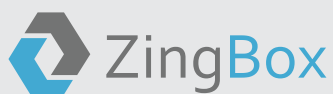

She also served as Chief Clinical Officer for the Provider business, where she was responsible for providing clinical leadership for the clinical evidence and intelligent evidence product lines. Included in this role, Tina led and contributed to a team of clinicians responsible for helping to communicate the value proposition of Micromedex Solutions in both domestic and international markets. In addition, she led the Truven editorial staff, who are responsible for creating and maintaining the content for all the evidence-based medicine solutions, including drug, disease, toxicology, patient education and surveillance content.

Dr. Moen received her Doctor of Pharmacy degree from Creighton University. Prior to moving into the healthcare information technology industry, she worked as a clinical pharmacist in the specialty areas of pediatrics, home health care, HIV, and organ transplantation.

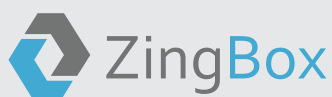
