



He is nationally recognized for his work in patient safety, including emergency airway management, opioid safety, and respiratory monitoring, and disclosure and resolution of unanticipated medical outcomes. Dr. Rothfield is the recipient of a Healthcare Heroes Award from the Baltimore Daily Record, as well as a Circle of Honor Award for Innovation in Patient Safety from the Maryland Patient Safety Center.

The presentation will discuss statistics of more than 400,000 U.S. citizens dying from preventable medical errors each year. Only heart disease and cancer kill more Americans. This presentation plots the progress — or lack thereof — that has been made on a 54-year timeline and challenge medical leaders to eliminate the never events that keep happening.
