Thinking Differently, The Psychology of Illusion

Vinh Giang

Magic is much more than sleight of hand. It's the ability to guide perspective, spotlight influence, and challenge belief systems. With humor, heart, and captivating showmanship, Vinh Giang transforms these three powerful components and shares how creating and cultivating the RIGHT influence in our lives can make the difference between tremendous success or limited mediocrity. What we know in this world is that everything that once seemed impossible can be reimagined and overcome. It takes suspending old belief systems. Unlocking mindsets. Innovating. Deliberate and definitive action. And yes, even a little magic.

With only six months to graduate, Vinh Giang left his degree in commerce and law to become an online magic teacher ultimately building a hugely successful online business, 52kards, which now serves over 800,000 students all around the world. This earned him the award of Top Young Entrepreneur in Australia.

Vinh Giang's real magic journey began when he finally understood what Robert Houdin (an amazing magician) meant when he said: "A magician is an actor playing the part of the magician." Once Vinh understood the meaning behind this quote, he focused all his energy on studying the art of performance and not the art of presentation. He has spent the last 15 years mastering the art of performance-enhanced communication, helping thousands of professionals worldwide to learn these skills.

Vinh is also the CEO of Luminary Productions which produces exceptional video for individuals and companies all around the globe.

Vinh's presentation will bring out the magic in you!

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"I believe that magicians are salespeople; they sell one of the most difficult products in the world. They sell magic - they sell the illusion. The way they're able to sell magic is by working ridiculously hard. It takes thousands and thousands of hours to be able to sell the illusion, to be able to really sell the magic. Imagine if you applied the same mindset to your company - imagine if you applied the same dedication to your business - think about what you could achieve."

He received his bachelors from Roanoke College with a concentration in Healthcare and his Master's in Business Administration from University of Phoenix. Darren is active in business and community affairs serving as a board member of the Endowment Board and Personal Committee of First Baptist Church in Roanoke. He was named a top 15 young professional under the age of 30 by the Valley Business Front Magazine (Roanoke, VA). He previously has sat on numerous boards such as the Economic Development Alliance, Medication Assistance Program, and NewVaConnects. Pharmacogenetics in the O.R.

Co-presenter: Darla Cline, RN

Mrs. Darla Cline brings over 43 years of experience working in the Operating Room. She currently serves as the OR Nurse Manager for Cookeville Regional Medical Center in Cookeville, TN, and is also an active member of AORN where she has held multiple roles in her local chapter.

Cline is presently a member of Cookeville Regional Medical Center's Patient Care Council, Infection Prevention Committee, Sepsis House Wide Committee, Stroke Committee, Hip Fracture Certification Committee and the Safety Committee. Darla has presented to the Tennessee Hospital Association's Leadership on multiple occasions on topics impacting OR team member communication and accountability, patient throughput and patient safety.

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In the spring of 2018, Cline was introduced to CQuentia at the HCP Conference in Miami. During her 43 years she has seen the impact of trial and error prescribing during the perioperative process. This allowed her to immediately recognize the importance of utilizing the patient's genetics to increase the standard of care during surgery. Cline acted quickly and took the leadership role in creating the vision for Cookeville Regional Medical Center's Pharmacogenomic Testing Program.

Cline's first step was to create her centers first Genetic Testing Council which includes the hospitals Director of Surgery, Chief Nursing Officer, Chief of Anesthesia, Pharmacy Director, Operating Room Nurse Manager, CVOR Anesthesiologist & Assistant to Chief Nursing Officer. Working together with her council and CQuentia, Cookeville Regional Medical Center successfully launched their Pharmacogenomic Testing Program on July 23, 2018.

By insuring the patient's genetic results are utilized throughout the patient continuum, the hospital's executive staff expect this program will help to maintain their leadership position as the #1 safest hospital in the state of Tennessee.

Co-presenter: Wendy Suhre, M.D.

Wendy Suhre, M.D. is a graduate of the University of Arizona School of Medicine. She trained in anesthesiology at the Medical University of South Carolina and is board certified in Anesthesiology.

Dr. Suhre has been practicing since 2013, the last four years at the University of Washington, one of the top 100 hospitals in the United States. She is the Medical Director of the Pre-Anesthesia Clinic and an assistant professor in the Department of Anesthesiology and Pain Medicine. Dr. Suhre's clinical and research interests include perioperative use of pharmacogenomics, preoperative anemia and blood management, and obstetric anesthesia.

In her free time, Dr. Suhre enjoys hiking with her husband and two puppies, road trips, and oil painting.

Learning objectives:

After attending this presentation, attendees will learn to:

- Recall that the use of pharmacogenomics is established in multiple disciplines across the field of medicine including cardiology, oncology, and Psychiatry, and is emerging in the field of Perioperative Medicine.
- Recognize that the efficacy, metabolism, and side effects of common drugs used during the perioperative period such as opiates, NSAIDS, and anesthetics are affected by genetic variation.
- Explain how pharmacogenomics can be used to identify patients at risk for Malignant hyperthermia and pseudocholinesterase deficiency which are among the most dangerous conditions for patients undergoing general anesthesia.
- Describe how pharmacogenomics testing may change perioperative outcomes.

Patty Skolnik

Patty Skolnik is a patient safety expert, educator and keynote presenter for Shared Decision-Making, Informed Consent, Dignity for the Patient and Patient and Provider Relationships in healthcare. She founded Citizens for Patient Safety to promote those conversations in healthcare settings that are proven to reduce medical harm. Patty travels worldwide to educate consumers, train medical professionals, and advise lawmakers about how to foster relationships, systems and environments.

Named one of CNN's "Intriguing People," Patty was also invited to the White House to discuss healthcare. She is the proud recipient of the National MITTS HOPE Award, the Colorado Patient Safety Coalition Patient Safety Leadership Award, and The Colorado Trial Lawyers Consumer Protection Award in honor of her son. She is featured in the book "Take Back your Government" by former Colorado State Senator Morgan Carroll and a guest author for the book "Patient Safety and Surgery" by Philip Stahel MD among others.

Her life experience has led Patty Skolnik down a hopeful and constructive path, and along with her warm sense of humor, she brings a powerfully positive mindset about our collective responsibilities for reducing medical harm to her training and advocacy endeavors.

- *Explain the value of having family members and or care partners present during informed consent and shared decision-making conversations*


